Maths Activities

With your child you could:

- Practice number bonds to 10 and 20 (numbers that + to make these totals).
- Count in 2's, 5's and 10's and learn the 2, 5 and 10 timetables. Then move on to learning 3 and 4 times tables.
- Add amounts of money in money box, purse or when out shopping. Even work out the change that they might get.
- Number hunts around the house or when out and about.
- Practice telling the time and understanding the time to O Clock, half past, quarter to, quarter past and then to each 5 minutes.
- Going on shape hunts around the house or when out and about.
- Creating own + , - , x and ÷ sums to complete.

Writing/Reading Activities

With your child you could:

- Retell stories.
- Read words when out and about on signs, posters etc.
- Create own stories, letters, postcards, poems, shopping lists etc.
- Write silly sentences using capital letters, full stops exclamation and question marks.
- Word hunts around the house or when out and about.
- Put words in alphabetical order.
- Introduce children to new words and their meanings.
- Play writing games and word sorting games and activities.
- Visit the Library to borrow and read books together.
