- Their dream school

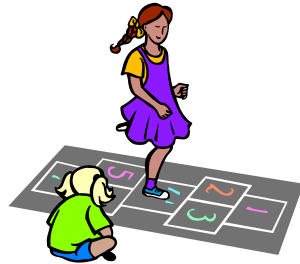


Games

Ask your child to find out about a variety of subjects by using the internet or by visiting your local library. Here are some ideas linked to our topics this year:

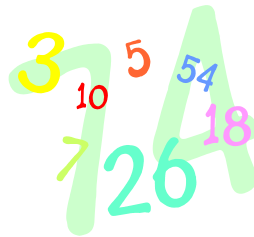
- Volcanoes and earthquakes

- Roll two dice to make a 2 digit number then write as many ways to make that number that you can think of

Eat fruit and vegetables as part of a balanced diet

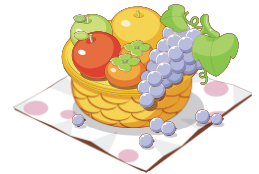
Play sport
