Key Vocabulary and definitions

Seasons	There are four seasons each year, spring , summer , autumn and winter .
Weather	The weather includes temperature outside, the wind, rain, cloud, sun and snow.
Daylight	Daylight is when it is light outside. The amount of daylight changes with each season .
Spring	In Spring the weather gets warmer. The leaves begin to grow on the trees. The days begin to get longer.
Summer	In Summer the weather gets hotter. The trees are full of leaves. The daytime is long and the nights are short.
Autumn	In Autumn the weather begins to get colder. The leaves start the fall from the trees. The daylight becomes less and the nights are longer.
Winter	In Winter the weather begins to get colder. The trees have bare branches. The daytime is short and the nights are long.

1. The days are longer in the summer.
2. The days are shorter in the winter.
3. The weather changes through the year.
4. The Earth tilts (leans) towards sun in the summer.
5. The Earth tilts (leans) away from the sun in the winter.
