
### Reception

In Reception we have been reading the story of the Extraordinary Gardener. We have enjoyed learning lots of new vocabulary and following instructions to plant our own seeds! We can't wait to watch them grow! We also really enjoyed maths day! We explored different creative ways of using Numicon. We especially enjoyed creating our own Numicon pictures.



### Lower Key Stage Two

We loved World Maths Day this week. Year Three completed lots of exciting activities such as learning about angles (acute, obtuse and right angles), 2D shapes and lines - horizontal, vertical, perpendicular and parallel, then identifying them in the witch that had been drawn before drawing our own pictures with as many as possible. We also created potions to get rid of the witch from our English topic. We measured, added and subtracted liquids. Finally we explored and made our own 3D shapes and explored their properties.
