KS1

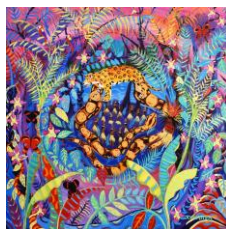

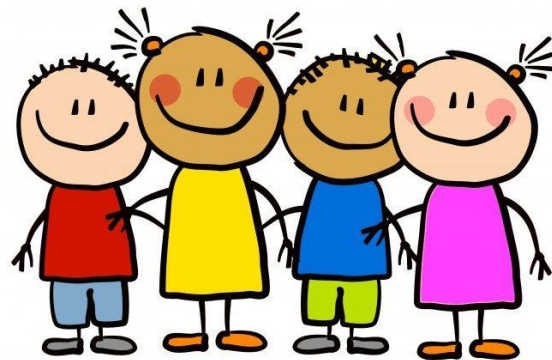
