- in PE lessons, all children with long hair must tie it back, again, for Health and Safety reasons.

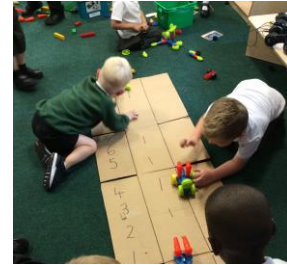

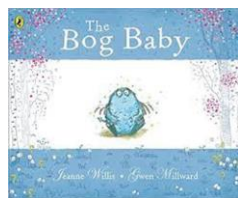
EYFS- Reception
