## EYFS- Reception

This week in Reception we have been following the children's interests by designing and making autumnal crowns! We collected leaves and discussed the different colours, shapes and sizes. We then created a castle for the Kings and Queens to live in using the outdoor large locking pieces.



## Lower KS2

In Lower KS2 we have reached the end of our first topic - the Science of Sound where we have been working hard to answer our Key Question 'How do you hear that noise?' We have enjoyed learning about sound through lots of different investigations helping us make new discoveries.

Our new topic will be in History where we are studying the Romans and in particular, their invasion of Britain. The children will also be learning Roman Numerals and they will be keen to show you what they've learnt.



## Upper KS2

This week, UKS2 have been learning all about micro-organisms. They have read information about them and looked at images. In addition, they have learnt about where they grow (everywhere!) and their effect they have - both good and bad - on all life. Following all of this research, the children have also written non-chronological reports about what they have learnt.

Next week, we will be planning and carrying out a science investigation about what helps micro-organisms grow and seeing if we can grow some of our own.
