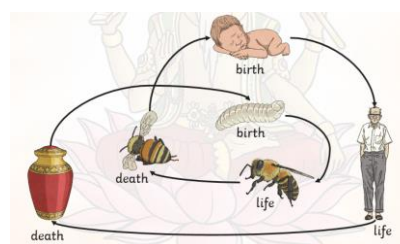
## Key Stage 1
