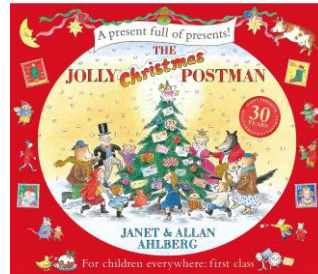

Reception

This week in Reception we have been reading the story The Jolly Christmas Postman. He very kindly delivered us our own class advent calendars! We have been discussing the different characters in the story and creating our own maps!



In LKS2 we have been working hard learning to write Kenning poems about animals. Next week we will continue this work and write poems about ourselves. In Maths, we have been learning new times tables with a focus on 3, 6, 9 and 7. There are lots of fun songs as well as Times Tables Rockstars to help your children learn them. We have now reached the end of our History topic on the Romans and their impact on Britain. It has been amazing to discover the legacy the Romans left in Britain. Can your children tell you any of the things we still use today that were introduced by the Romans nearly 2000 years ago?



The Year 6 children from 6J and 5/6M visited Stockport Armoury on Tuesday for a 'Crucial Crew' visit, in order to prepare them for becoming more independent and mindful of their choices ready for starting secondary school! The children had different presentations from Greater Manchester Police, a dentist, Canal and River Trust and Transport for Greater Manchester.
