Key Stage 1

KS1 have had a super half term and everybody has worked incredibly hard and settled in well!

In Science, we have been looking at seasonal changes and investigating what happens to animals throughout the different seasons. This week, we went for a walk through the forest area and found lots of different animals and their homes. We discussed the different habitats of each animal and identified which animals will start to hibernate.



Lower Key Stage 2

This week in history we have been analysing and comparing Roman and Celtic housing. We have learned about the vast improvements the Romans made to housing and we were surprised to learn that the Romans invented underfloor heating! We also discussed which type of Roman house we would choose to live in and why.



Upper Key Stage 2

This week in History we have explored the life and reforms made by The Earl of Shaftsbury. We have learned how he brought about change for the poor, working women and children during the Industrial Revolution. He improved the lives of so many people and revolutionised society, working conditions and education for the better.
