Lower Key Stage 2

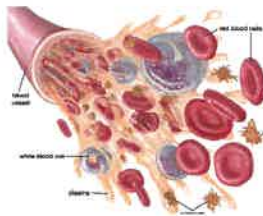
To start this half term the children are learning how to write a non-chronological report about the human skeleton. This links closely with our Science topic about Nutrition and the Human Body. This week the children have also enjoyed sharing what they have learned so far about the Romans as well as Roman Baths. It was surprising to learn that many of the activities and facilities we have today in our leisure centres were introduced by the Romans 2,000 years ago.



Upper Key Stage 2

This week, the children in Years 5 and 6 have started their new Science topic looking at the circulatory system. This started with the children identifying what they knew about the heart, circulation, diet and health. In addition, they posed questions about what they wanted to find out.




The children have learnt that the blood is not just a liquid; it contains solids too. The children researched what red blood cells, white blood cells, platelets and plasma do.



Key Stage One

This week, in History the children have started their new topic "The Great Fire of London". Each class discussed what information they already knew and made a list of questions that they want to find out.

In Science, we have continued our learning of "Animals including Humans" and have been learning about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
