EYFS

In Maths, the children have really enjoyed using the scales to investigate the mass of objects. The children identified heavier and lighter objects and were able to explain how they knew!

Key Stage 1

This week, the children have learnt more about Florence Nightingale and what hospitals were like during the Crimean War. We discussed how Florence educated others on keeping hospitals clean to stop the spread of diseases.

In Science we have been looking at food groups and what a balanced diet is. We talked about how different food groups help our bodies.

Year 1 have been writing their own Traditional Tale where a character is trapped by a villain and they make a plan to escape. Year 2 have been writing their own narrative based on the story Grandpa's Island.



Lower Key Stage 2

This week in lower Key Stage 2 we have been examining the geographical differences between Brazil and England. We discussed the difference in population, language and which continent they are located in.

In Science, we have been continuing our learning about living things and their habitats by looking for different animals and micro-habitats in our forest area. We were shocked to find so many different types of animals so close to school! From worms, woodlice and squirrels, we made sure we did not disturb them!

In English, Year 3 have been writing a character narrative based on 'Seen and not Heard' by Katie May Green. Years 3 / 4 and 4 have been writing a myth narrative based on 'Arthur and the Rope'.

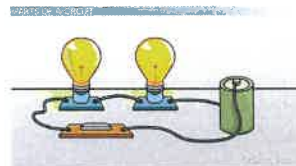
