EYFS

This week in Maths, the children have been learning their number bonds to 10 as well as recognising odd and even numbers. In Literacy, they have also been applying their phonics knowledge to write sentences.

KS1

This week, Year 2 went to visit Smithills Farm as part of our Science topic. The children were able to have a ride on the donkeys, feed the llamas and hold different baby animals. All the children behaved incredibly well and had a wonderful day!

In Geography, we have been looking at how we can improve the school environment for bees. We discussed some of the things that impact bees and different things we could do to save the bees and stop the bee population from declining.



LKS2

This week in LKS2, we have been learning about the main physical features of Brazil. We discussed the differences between a human and a physical feature and came up with different examples of both.

In science, we have been creating simple circuits and experimenting with different materials to see whether they conduct or insulate electricity. We discovered that most of the conductors we tested were made of metal!

Upper Key Stage 2

This week, Year 6 have been working incredibly hard in preparation for their SATs. For the first time, they spent time in the hall completing assessments under test conditions. Every single member of the class displayed a PMA (positive mental attitude), tried their best and showed resilience.

In Maths, the children are working hard to develop their understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages. They have learnt how to find a percentage of an amount and how to find equivalence.

Year 6 are continuing to be amazing ambassadors within school. They especially enjoy being Reading Buddies with the children in EYFS and sharing stories on a Friday afternoon is the highlight of the week.
