In Geography this week we explored the different layers of the ocean and what creatures live there.

In Maths Year 1 have been exploring the beginning of multiplication, looking at equal groups and arrays.



Year 2 have been measuring using grams and kilograms.



This week the children have been working hard to create narratives. There has been some wonderful descriptive language and use of direct speech in the writing – we are very proud. In Science, we have been studying plants. Last week, we planted carrot seeds in different soil types. This week, we have been dissecting flowers to study the parts of a flower needed for pollination using magnifying glasses and microscopes to observe the flowers up close.
